Meeting was called to order at 2:57 PM by Chairperson, Sabrina McElroy.

Motion to adopt agenda was made by Natasha Boyd and seconded by Karen McIntosh. Motion carried with all ayes.

Motion to consider approval of the minutes was made by Mary Sloas and seconded by Natasha Boyd. Motion carried with all ayes.

Reports for student academic success:

*CSIP: The state says we need to have three goals but we have four goals.

First Goal: A goal for gap free and reduced students, special education or IEP students.

We have identified gaps they are: IEP students and free and reduced students.

Second Goal:

Novice reduction. We have to reduce by 50% in 5years.

Third Goal:

Improve math and reading scores.

Fourth Goal:

Program reviews. We need a score of 97 and above in each category.

***30/60/90 Day Plan:**

This plan is used district wide. The goals are set by the state. Big Rock based on information in CSIP academic performance. We are buying Fountas and Pinnell benchmark assessment system for reading. This tool will accurately assess independent and instructional level skills of students relative to the Fountas and Pinnell Text Level Gradient. This lets us know exactly where students are at in reading. Our two big rocks are academic performance and interventions. Sixty days strategies in red if not completed. Sixty day when we will be successful. This is continuous school improvement plan.

***Testing Weight Changes:**

All of next generation learners will be 33.3% so all three are equal. AMO changed for this year. We need to go up one point up to 53.6. We are only six points from being a school of proficiency.

***Teaching and Learning improvement priorities:**

We had an audit in December. Teaching and Learning 3.6, 3.12, 3.2. All plans have been discussed with the teachers based on student data with an extensive focus on an improvement priority in our three areas. The audit team will be back next year and look at three areas and ask if we have improved in priority areas.

***SBDM Preliminary allocations for 2016-17 school year:**

Allocations for positions for next year did not change from last year based on enrollment.

Consider Curriculum:

*Dedicated Math and Reading:

Since math and reading are an area of focus we will be dedicating a math and reading block next year. It will consist of two hours uninterrupted reading block. K-3 students placed according to their level and every two weeks they are reassessed. We will monitor and move students to class reading group according to their skill level. We will have an hour and a half uninterrupted math block and RTI group in the afternoons. K, 1, and 2 will teach only math/reading. Heather is gifted and talented teacher so she can pull the students that qualify and work with them or collaborate with the teacher. Bonnie Cole can do the same thing.

Consider Budget Updates:

\$18,635.27 is our balance but this doesn't count bill that will come out of this amount.

Data dashboard:

On website using our data, answer five data wise questions to move students forward.

Communicating/Sharing-Students, Parents, and Teachers:

Site base will do a working session at LBJ with board members, Mr. Gibson and Mr. Meadows. This will be on the 22nd from four to five.

Ms. Sloas stated that if the BRIGANCE Early Childhood Screen II is an accurate assessment and data-gathering tool to use with students in kindergarten and first grade. Sabrina McElroy state that we currently use it to screen kindergarten students only but would like to start using the tool to screen first grade students and continue to gather data on each student with this tool.

Motion to use the Brigance screen to assess first grade students for the school year 2016/2017 was made by Mary Sloas and seconded by Karen McIntosh. Motion carried with all ayes.
